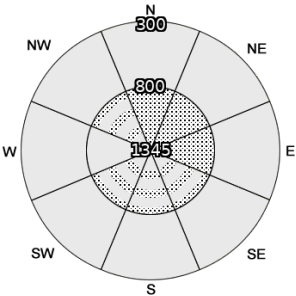


Avalanche Hazard Forecast - FOR PERIOD 18:00HRS Fri 01/02/2019 TO 18:00HRS Sat 02/02/2019



Hazard Level	Avalanche Probability
Very High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. Numerous very large, often extremely large natural avalanches can be expected.
High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. In some cases, numerous large, often very large sized natural avalanches can be expected.
Considerable	Natural and human triggered avalanches possible, in some cases large, in isolated cases very large sized natural avalanches are possible.
Moderate	Very large sized natural avalanches are unlikely. Human triggering possible in indicated steep places.
Low	Only small and medium sized natural avalanches are possible. Human triggering possible in steep, extreme terrain.

Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers in the early evening then mainly dry. Moderate North-North-East winds overnight ease and become variable during the day. Freezing to low levels.

Forecast Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

Localised areas of unstable windslab will be present on many aspects with greatest accumulations on North to East aspects above 800 metres. Gullies , scarp slopes and corrie rims will be most affected. Fragile cornices will be present mainly above North through East to South aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

Observed Avalanche Hazard - Fri 01/02/2019

Observed Weather Influences

Moderate Northerly winds and snow showers. The freezing level was close to sea level.

Observed Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

Moderately to weakly bonded windslab persists in sheltered areas, mainly on North to East aspects above 800 metres. During the day further fresh windslab was being deposited mainly on South-East to South-West aspects above 900 metres. Deeper accumulations are generally fairly localised with gullies and corrie rims most affected. Fragile cornices are also present mainly above North through East to South aspects. The avalanche hazard is Moderate.

Mountain Conditions

Observed Mountain Travel Conditions	Snow at all altitudes - very hard going on foot. Poor visibility. Winds approximately 10 - 20 mph.
Comments	Remaining cold through the weekend.
