

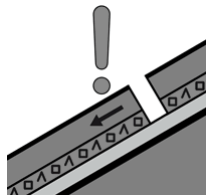

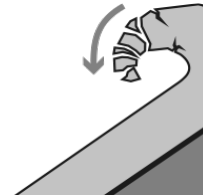

Wind Slab



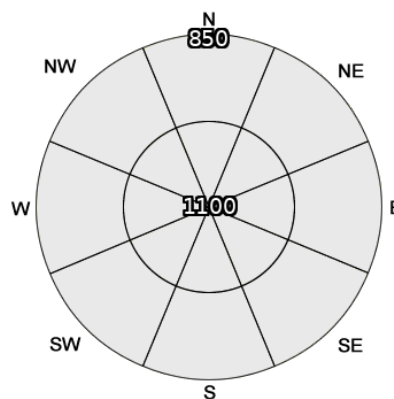
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Redistribution of existing snow will deposit fresh unstable windslab in sheltered areas, mainly on East through South to South-West aspects above 800 metres. Deeper accumulations will be generally fairly localised; coire rims, gully exits and scarp slopes will be most affected. Instabilities will also persist in the older windslab lying mainly on North to East aspects. Cornices will be fragile and occur mainly above North through East to South aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will remain cold, freezing at all levels. After the odd early evening snow shower the period is expected to be dry. Winds will be strong North-North-Easterly during the evening, then backing moderate North-Westerly overnight and Westerly during the day.
