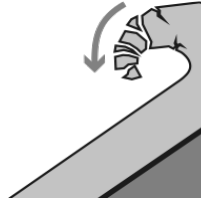

Wind Slab



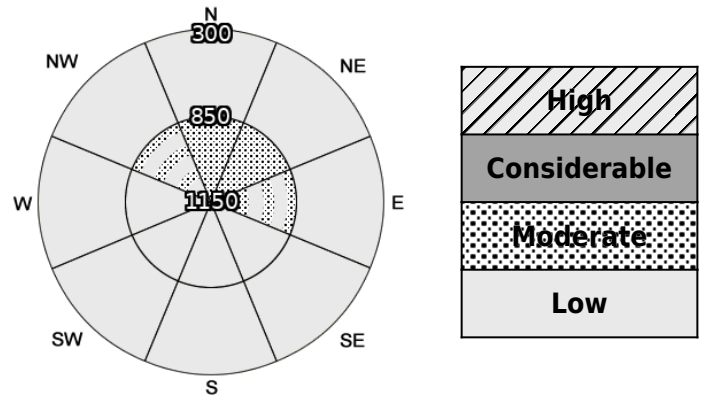

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New, localised areas of moderately bonded windslab will develop with the greatest accumulations being mostly on North to East aspects above 850 metres. Gullies exits, scarp slopes and corrie rims will be particularly affected. Fragile cornices will be present mainly above North through to East aspects but not exclusively so. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, remaining cold and dry. During the morning snow showers falling to all levels these will ease in the afternoon with the freezing level will slowly rising to around 600 metres. South-Westerly winds will strengthen becoming strong over the summits in the afternoon.

Comments

Icy paths in many places. Remaining cold, some new snow coming then a change developing on Tuesday.
