

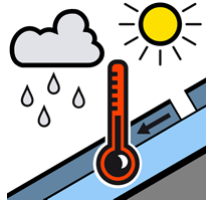

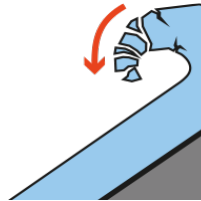

Wind Slab



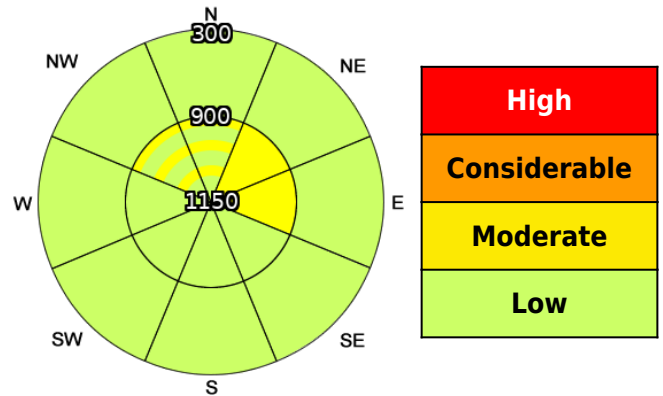

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will become moist at all levels for a short period during the early hours of the morning leading to some surface wet snow instabilities and possible cornice collapses. The snowpack will consolidate as the freezing level lowers again. Then, light accumulations of new windslab will form in sheltered locations with the greatest deposits on North to East aspects mainly above 900 metres these are not expected to be significant. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, snow showers these will turn to sleet and maybe even rain as the freezing level rises to near summit level and above for short period. The freezing level will fall again during the day to around 600 metres with further light snow above this elevation. Strong winds will be Southerly overnight becoming more Westerly during the day and easing.

Comments

New snow amounts during the day are not expected to be significant. Drier late afternoon and on Tuesday.
