Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

A period of instability is expected overnight as the snowpack becomes wet. Stability will improve in the early hours with the onset of colder conditions. Snow showers will then deposit areas of fresh unstable windslab on North-East to South-East aspects above 900 metres. These areas are not expected to be extensive with the tops of slopes and gullies most affected. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight snow will briefly turn to rain at all levels as the freezing level rises above summit level. Through the day it will be colder with snow showers. The freezing level will be around 600 metres.
