

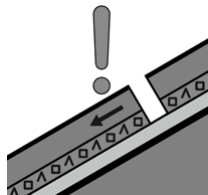

#### Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 05/02/2019

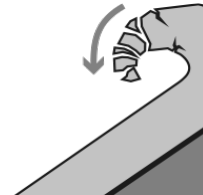
##### Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab



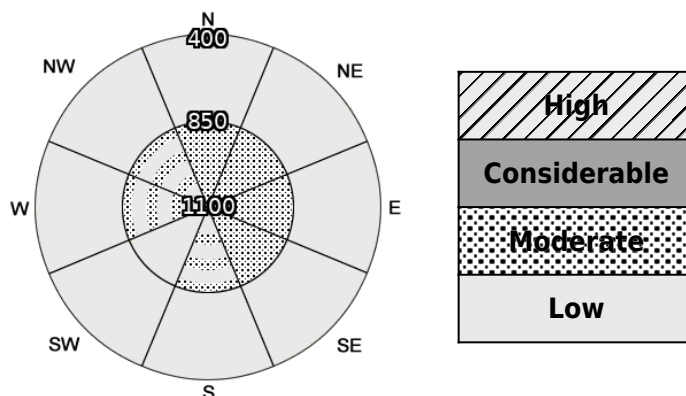
Persistent Weak Layers

##### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Instabilities will remain in the recently deposited moderately bonded windslab lying mainly on North through East to South-East aspects above 850 metres. During the day some redistribution of existing snow will deposit unstable windslab in sheltered areas mainly on West to North aspects. Gullies, coire rims and scarp slopes will be most affected. Cornices will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



##### Forecast Weather Influences

Winds are expected to be moderate Westerly backing Southerly overnight; South-Easterly during the day and strengthening to strong. After a little snow in the early evening the period will be dry. Overnight the summit temperature is expected to be around -4 degrees Celsius rising to -1.5 degrees during the day.

##### Comments

It looks as if it will remain wintry this week with some further snowfall.
