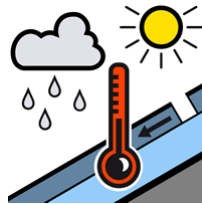

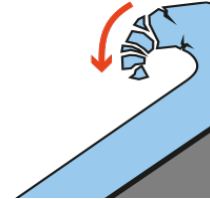

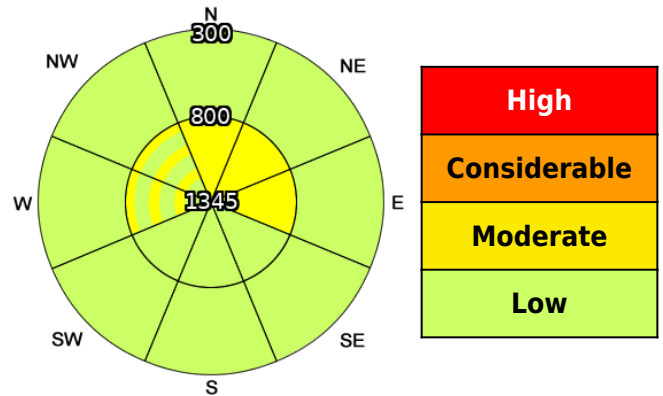

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

After a period of increased instability in the evening, mainly affecting West through North to East aspects above 800 metres, stability in the existing snowpack will improve as the temperature drops. Fresh unstable windslab will be deposited during the period with greatest accumulations on North-West through North to East aspects above 900 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Strong South-East winds soon veer South-Westerly in the evening and then Back Southerly during the day. Showers throughout, initially as rain to summit level will turn to snow down to around 600 metres during the day. Freezing level briefly above the summits dropping to around 700 metres during the day.
