

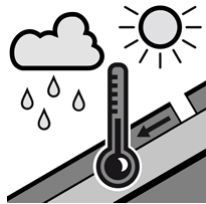

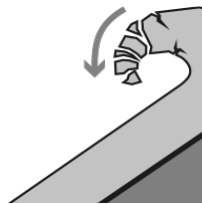

Wind Slab



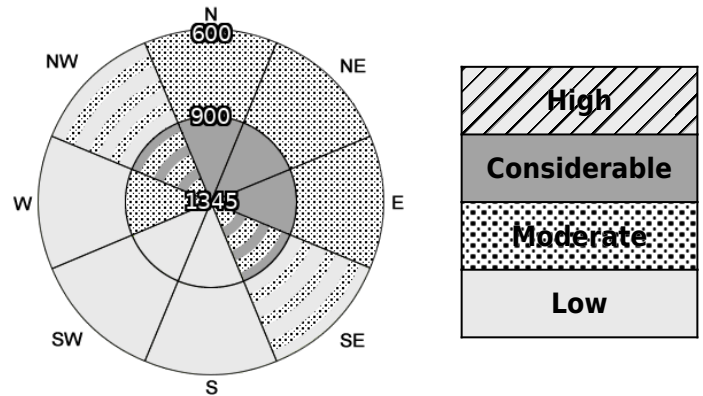
Wet Snow

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fresh windslab will be added to the existing deposits during the night. These will become increasing unstable as the freezing level rises and snowpack gets wet. Avalanches are likely on mainly North to East avalanches above 900 metres. Cornices will be prone to collapse. Stability should improve in the afternoon at the freezing level drops. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight showers will fall as snow above about 700 metres. It will then be a wet day with plenty of precipitation which will turn to rain at all but the highest levels as the freezing level briefly rises to around 1400 metres. Rain will turn back to snow above around 1000 metres during the afternoon. Strong winds will be from the South.

Comments

A wild day expected tomorrow. However, with temperatures dropping and more snow expected on Saturday it should improve winter conditions.
