Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New accumulations of windslab will develop on South-East to South-West aspects mostly above 900 metres. Greatest amounts will be around gully exits and corrie rims and crag aprons. Older windslab instabilities will persist on steep sheltered North to East aspects above 1000 metres. Deposits of new windslab will develop on these aspects during the afternoon. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight there will be snowfall on moderate North-West to Northerly winds, this will clear to leave a dry day with spells of sunshine. Light Westerly winds will become moderate South-Westerly through the afternoon. The freezing level will rise from 400 metres to 700 metres by the end of the day.
