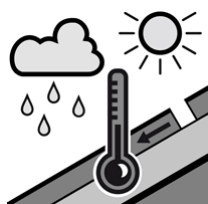


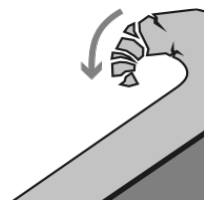

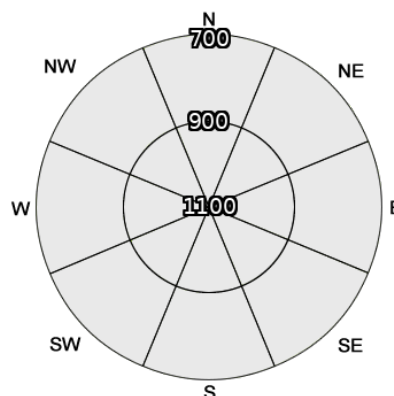

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The moist snowpack will continue to deplete and be generally well consolidated in most locations. Some limited wet snow surface instabilities will persist on steepest slopes, any cornice lines around coire rims above North through East to South-East aspects remain suspect during thawing conditions. An additional hazard of ice and rock fall exists from all crag areas. The avalanche hazard will be Low



Forecast Weather Influences

A mild South-Westerly airflow will continue to affect the area. Strong South-South-West winds overnight will becoming more Southerly and ease only a little as the day progresses. It will be mostly dry, although cloudy with the Freezing levels remaining above the summits.

Comments

Little change – depleted and wet snowpack. Ice and rockfall an additional hazard below crags in thawing conditions
