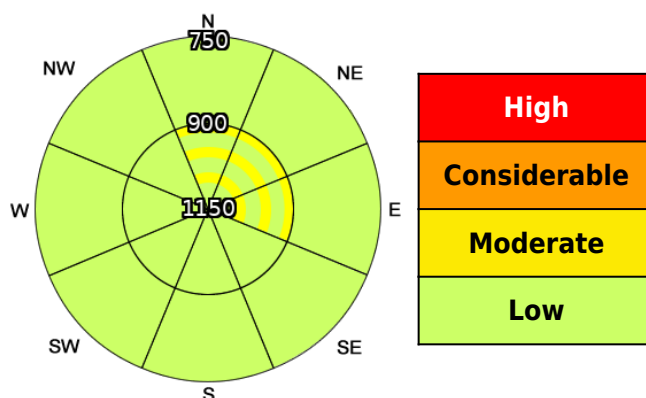


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 18/02/2019****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Wet Snow****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

New snow accumulations are expected to be light and shallow but localise moderately bonded windslab deposits may start to develop in sheltered locations. The greatest accumulations will be mainly on North to Easterly aspects above 900 metres. Gully exits and steep coire headwalls will be particularly affected. The moist snowpack will start to re-freeze and consolidate. Cornices will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

The freezing level will fall to around 900 metres then rise to around 1100 metres with precipitation bringing a mixture of rain, sleet and snow at these elevations. New snow accumulations are not expected to be extensive. Winds will be strong and mainly South-South-Westerly.

Comments

Fluctuating freezing levels will give very changeable conditions for the next few days.
