

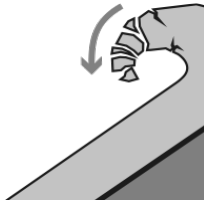

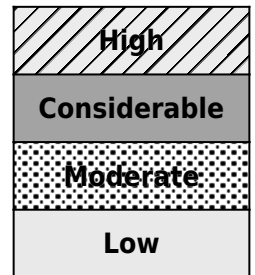
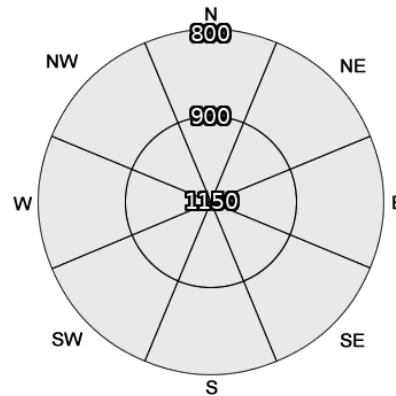

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

A return to mainly drier conditions will aid the consolidation process within the snowpack. The snowpack will be soft and moist at all levels with general stability being good. On steeper slopes surface wet snow instabilities will exist but these should generally be avoidable, these areas will mainly be around the tops of summit gullies and on steep scarp slopes, any remaining cornices should be treated with respect as they will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Mild conditions will continue with the freezing level well above the summits, it will become much drier than Wednesday, any precipitation will be mainly light drizzle. Winds will be mainly fresh from a generally Southerly direction.

Comments

Remaining mild but at least it is drier! Best snow cover is to be found in the higher Northern and Easterly facing corries. Cornices will remain prone to collapse
