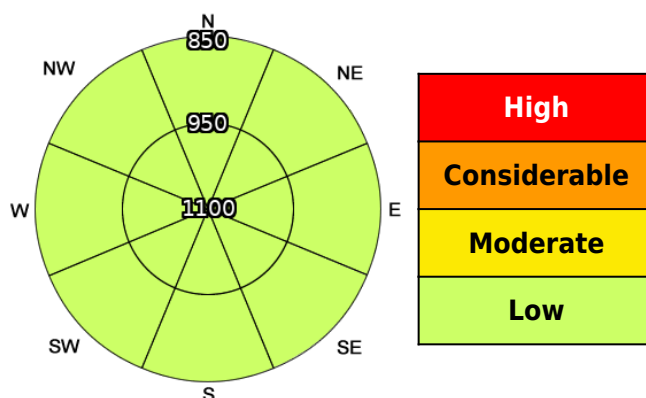

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The existing patchy snowpack, which lies mainly on North to East aspects above 850 metres, will continue to slowly thaw and will be generally stable. During the afternoon windslab will be deposited in sheltered areas, mainly on North-West to North-East aspects above 950 metres. Accumulations are expected to be generally shallow. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will be mainly Southerly; moderate overnight, then strengthening during the morning to strong for the rest of the day. Overnight the freezing level is expected to lower towards the summits and then be around the summits during the day. A period of precipitation overnight is expected to fall as sleet on the summits; then during the afternoon there will be some snowfall above around 950 metres.

Comments

There is more possibility of some wintry weather than there has been for a while!
