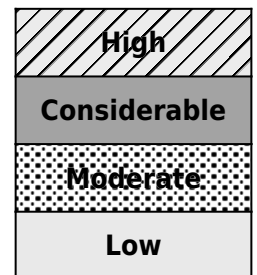
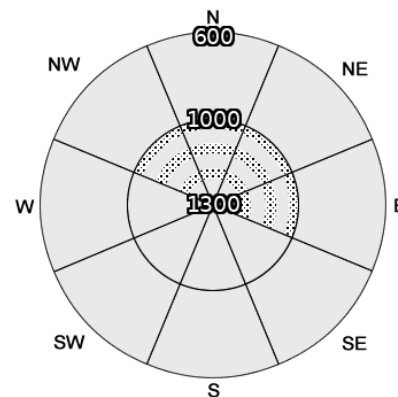
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Old snow pack firm and icy. New accumulations of windslab will accumulate in localised wind sheltered places on mostly North-West through North to Easterly aspects above 1000 metres, unstable where it achieves any depth. Gully exits, coire rims, crag aprons most affected. Snow cover elsewhere will be thin and is not expected to be significant. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds strengthening to storm force South-Westerly overnight lessening during the afternoon. Freezing level around 800 metres. Precipitation falling as sleet and snow on summits at first then lying above 600 metres.

Comments

A significant change to colder temperatures, snow fall and very strong winds over next days. Old snowpack areas will be firm and very icy.
