
Avalanche Hazard Forecast - FOR PERIOD 18:00HRS Sun 03/03/2019 TO 18:00HRS Mon 04/03/2019



Hazard Level	Avalanche Probabilty
Very High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. Numerous very large, often extremely large natural avalanches can be expected.
High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. In some cases, numerous large, often very large sized natural avalanches can be expected.
Considerable	Natural and human triggered avalanches possible, in some cases large, in isolated cases very large sized natural avalanches are possible.
Moderate:	Very large sized natural avalanches are unlikely. Human triggering possible in indicated steep places.
Low	Only small and medium sized natural avalanches are possible. Human triggering possible in steep, extreme terrain.

Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers easing overnight becoming lighter and less frequent during the day. Moderate generally Westerly winds. Becoming colder.

Forecast Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

Additional windslab will be present on North to South-East aspects as showers continue. Weaker windslab expected to be localised and confined to steepest coire rims and gully exits above 950m. Small collapse prone cornices may overhang some of these places. Good stability in all other locations. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate

Observed Weather Influences

Overnight snow showers extended into the day, some persistent. Strong West South West winds. Colder.

Observed Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

Thin covering of fresh snow in many places above 850m. Stability is good in many locations but localised accumulations of thin weak windslab are present on very steep North to East aspects above 1000m. Two small natural dry slab avalanches observed on a North-East aspect at 1050m just after midday in the Inner Coire of Coire Ardair. The avalanche hazard is Moderate

Mountain Conditions

Observed Mountain Travel Conditions	No snow below 850m but with some drifting at higher altitudes. Cloud base was at 950 metres all day. Winds 30 -40 mph, progress difficult and tiring, blowing us over on occasions
Comments	Less shower activity on Monday but colder.
