

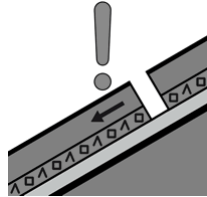

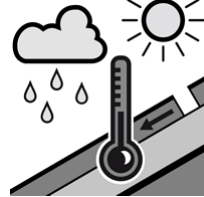

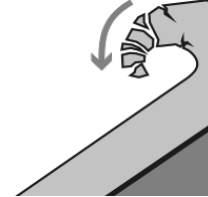
Wind Slab

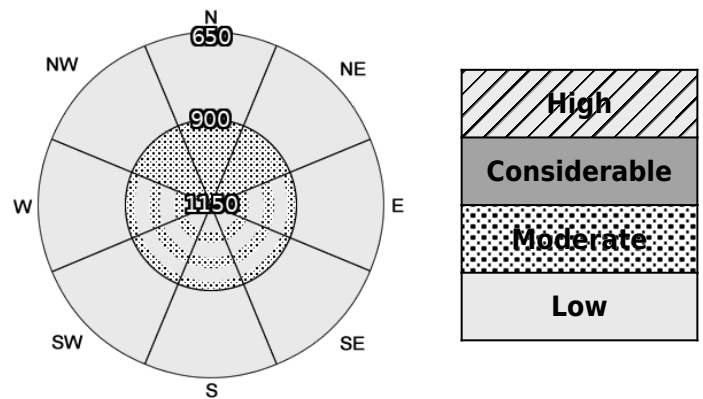

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

A rise in freezing levels and rain will lead to some wet snow instabilities particularly on steeper slopes on all aspects. This will be followed by some partial consolidation of the moist snowpack. However, some windslab instabilities may persist in deep older deposit on North-West to North-East aspects. New areas of moderately bonded windslab will form in sheltered Southerly aspects mainly above 900 metres these are not expected to be significant. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

Overnight, the freezing level will rise above the summits with some showers of snow and rain, winds will be moderate North-Easterly. During the day the freezing level will slowly fall to around 600 metres by late afternoon. Winds will back becoming Northerly and strengthen, strong at summit level accompanied by light snow showers.

**Comments**

A ridge of high pressure will build in from the West on Thursday with snow showers dying out.
