
Avalanche Hazard Forecast - FOR PERIOD 18:00HRS Wed 06/03/2019 TO 18:00HRS Thu 07/03/2019



Hazard Level	Avalanche Probabilty
Very High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. Numerous very large, often extremely large natural avalanches can be expected.
High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. In some cases, numerous large, often very large sized natural avalanches can be expected.
Considerable	Natural and human triggered avalanches possible, in some cases large, in isolated cases very large sized natural avalanches are possible.
Moderate:	Very large sized natural avalanches are unlikely. Human triggering possible in indicated steep places.
Low	Only small and medium sized natural avalanches are possible. Human triggering possible in steep, extreme terrain.

Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers are expected overnight and during the morning; initially above around 900 metres, then later above 500 metres as the freezing level lowers to 600 metres. Moderate North-East winds will strengthen and back to strong Northerly.

Forecast Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

Fresh unstable windslab will be deposited in wind sheltered areas, mainly on South-East through South to West aspects above 950 metres. Older, deeper, unstable windslab will also be present, mainly on North to East aspects. Unstable cornices will build. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

Observed Avalanche Hazard - Wed 06/03/2019

Observed Weather Influences

Snow showers above around 700 metres, with moderate to strong East backing North-East wind. The freezing level rose to around 900 metres.

Observed Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

Fresh moderately bonded windslab is being deposited in wind sheltered areas on many aspects, mainly above 950 metres. Most affected aspects are South through West to North-West. Recently deposited moderately bonded windslab is also present, mainly on North to East aspects. Unstable cornices are present mainly above North to East aspects. The avalanche hazard is Moderate.

Mountain Conditions

Observed Mountain Travel Conditions	New snow above 600m, with drifting at higher altitudes. Cloud base was around 900m all day with poor visibility. Winds 20-30 mph, with stronger gusts.
Comments	Remaining wintry.
