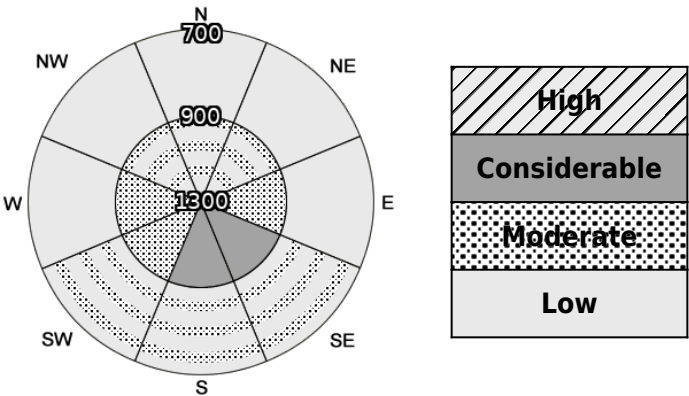

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New accumulations of poorly bonded windslab will develop during the day on mostly steep wind sheltered South-East to South-Westerly aspects above 900 metres. Steep slope tops, corrie rims and gully tops most affected. Also cross loaded accumulations on East and West aspects expected. Instabilities persisting on Easterly aspects. Elsewhere consolidation will take place due to the rise and fall of freezing levels. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds light Easterly at first in the evening becoming very strong Northerly through the night and for the rest of the forecast period. Persistent snow fall, sometimes heavy through the day, lying at summit levels initially then above 400 metres by the end of the day. Heavy drifting.

Comments

Significant snowfall with strong North winds and drifting expected.
