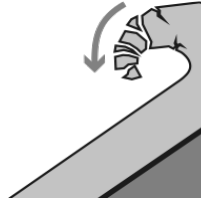

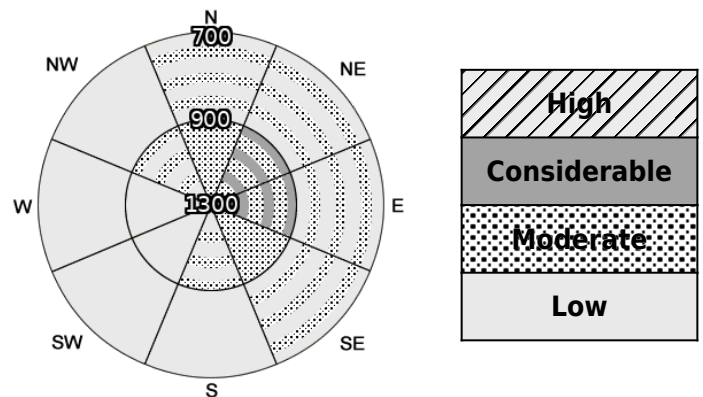

##### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will continue to develop on Northerly through East to South-East aspects mainly above 900 metres. Greatest amounts will be around corrie rims, steep convexities and gully exits on North-East to East aspects. Windslab will also be present below 900 metres on steep banks. Fragile cornices will continue to develop. Localised windslab affecting other aspects due to cross loading. Wind exposed slopes will be mostly firm and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



##### Forecast Weather Influences

Light snow showers are expected during the first part of the night and during the day. Strong Westerly winds will ease and back to the South before increasing moderate to strong during the morning and veering to the West by mid afternoon. The 400 metres freezing level will rise to 600 metres.
