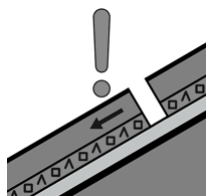
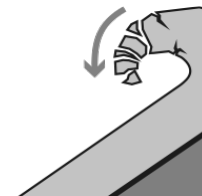
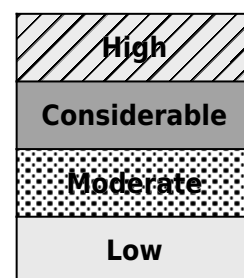
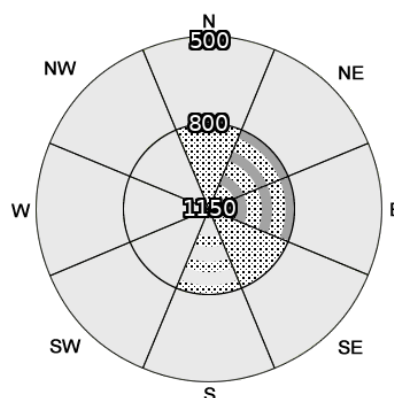


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE CONSIDERABLE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Sunday 10/03/2019****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Persistent Weak Layers****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Fresh poorly bonded windslab continues to develop in localised areas on North-East and Easterly aspects above 800 metres. Most affected are gully tops, corrie rims and steep slope tops. Cornice development noted on these aspects. Cross loading in very sheltered locations on North, South-Easterly and Southerly aspects. South-West to North-Westerly slopes have been scoured in the strong winds. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Remaining cold with freezing level around 300 metres. Westerly winds easing overnight, backing Southerly and veering Westerly and increasing in strength to fresh to strong tomorrow. Snow showers dying out overnight but becoming more frequent during the day.

Comments

The hills now look very wintry with some deep accumulations in places due to the drifting at all altitudes.
