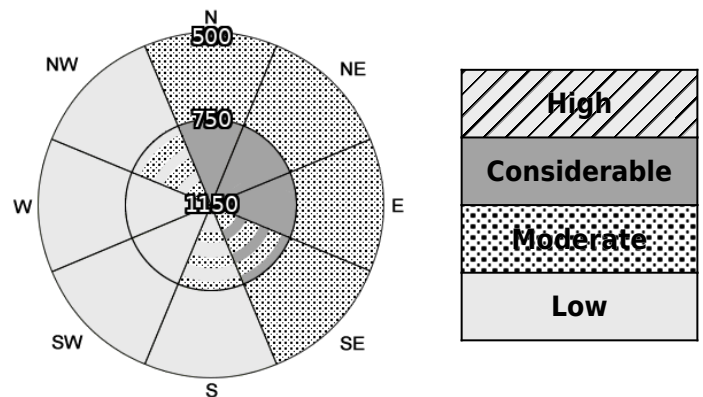

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fresh deposits will be added to the existing areas of unstable windslab on North to East aspects above 750 metres where avalanches are likely. Some sheltered locations on other aspects may also hold pockets of windslab. Cornices will be prone to collapse. However, exposed windward aspects will be scoured and hold little snow. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight snow showers will ease through the day. Westerly winds will back to the South through the afternoon. The freezing level will be around 400 metres overnight, rising slowly to 800 metres by the end of the day.
