

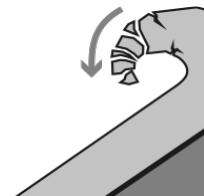

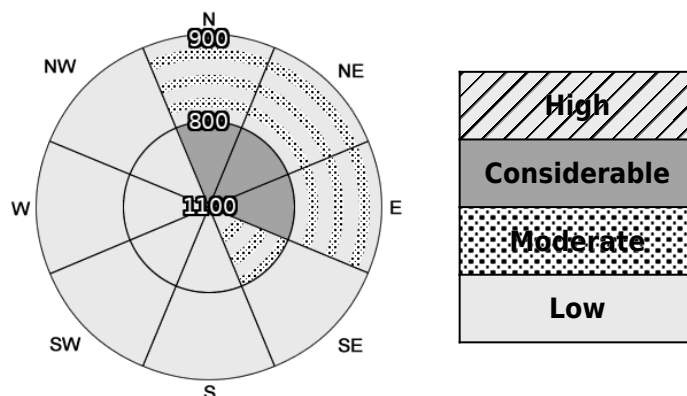
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Weaker, marginally bonded windslab will continue to build in sheltered lee locations, primarily on steep North to East aspects above 800 metres where avalanches are likely. New cornice development expected above very steep coire backwalls and gully tops of the same aspects. Better stability on ridges and recently wind scoured areas. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

A strong North-West airflow will bring further snow showers throughout. The winds; strong West and West-North-West to start will moderate as new fronts back West and West-South-West, strengthening again Southerly by the end of the period. The Freezing level will rise slowly 200 to 600 metres during the day.
