

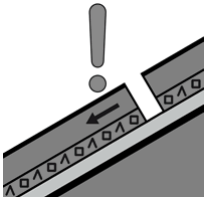

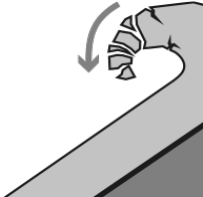

Wind Slab



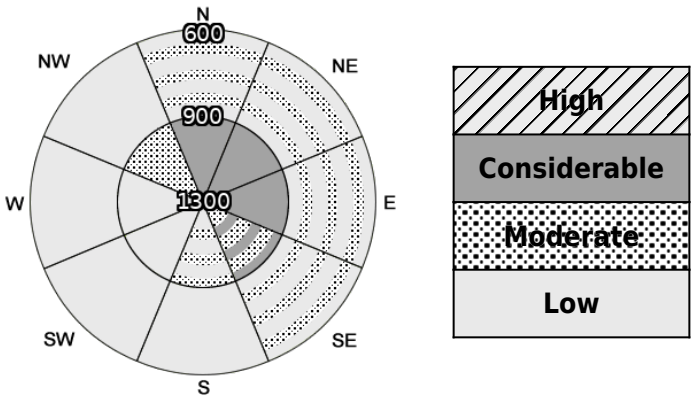

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will rapidly build overnight and through the day on North-West through North to Easterly aspects above 900 metres where avalanches are likely. Gully tops, Coire rims and crag aprons most affected. Unstable cross loaded deposits will also be present on other aspects such as gully flanks. Cornices will be unstable. Below this level localised windslab will be present on steep banks. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Significant snowfall overnight and persistent light snow sometimes heavy through the day falling to 300- 400 metres. Winds gale to storm force Southerly overnight, remaining strong South-West to South-South-Westerly with drifting. Freezing level around 600 metres.

Comments

Storm force winds and significant snowfall with heavy drifting expected in the day
