

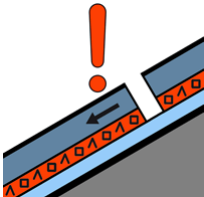

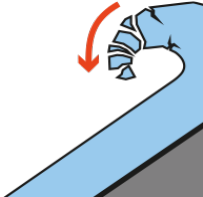

Wind Slab



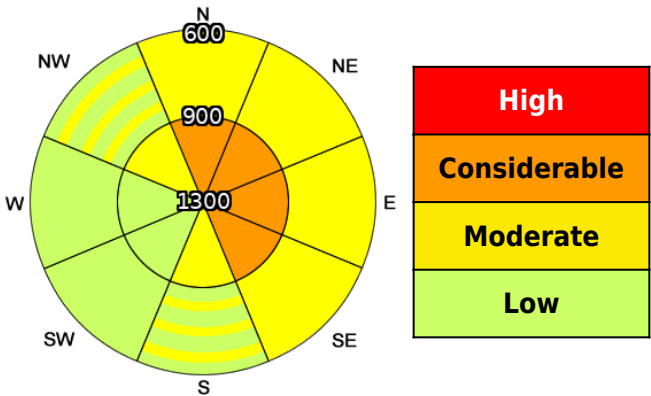
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will continue to build overnight and through the day on Northerly through East to South-East aspects above 900 metres where avalanches are likely. Gully tops, Coire rims and crag aprons will be most affected. Unstable cross loaded deposits will also be present on other aspects such as gully flanks. Cornices will be unstable. Below this level localised windslab will be present on steep banks. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Snowfall will continue throughout the forecast period above 700 to 800 metres; this will be heaviest during the first part of the night. Strong to gale force South-Westerly winds will veer North-Westerly, then back Westerly towards the end of the day. The freezing level will be between 700 and 800 metres.

Comments

Expect poor visibility and heavy drifting .
