

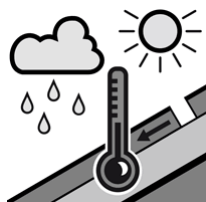

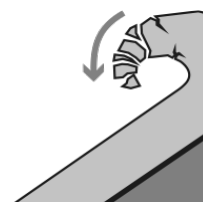

Wind Slab



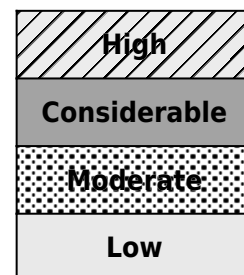
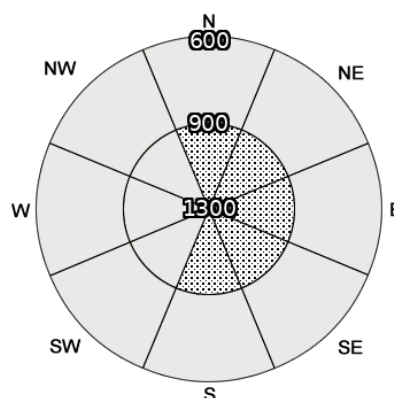

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

After a period of instability overnight the snowpack will continue to generally consolidate at all levels due to fluctuations freezing levels. New accumulations of windslab will develop through the day mostly above 950 metres on mainly Northerly to South-East aspects. Gully tops, coire rims and crag aprons most affected. Cornices will be prone to collapse. Elsewhere stability will be generally good. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Freezing levels will be around 850 metres rising to summit levels overnight before returning to around 700 metres early morning. Winds moderate to strong West to West North-Westerly during the period. Precipitation Sleet and snow at summit levels overnight, some rain below. Then snow showers through the day.

Comments

Fluctuating temperatures and freezing levels will help with snowpack consolidation. Good but deep snow cover.
