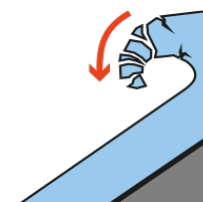

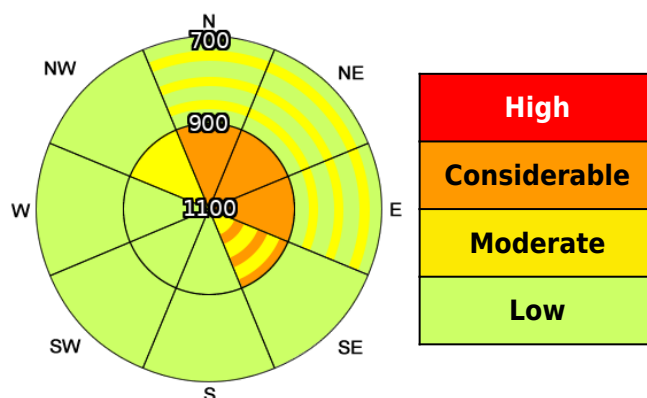

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Large collapse prone cornices above North to Easterly aspects have the potential to add significant loadings onto a weakly bonded snowpack below. Avalanches are likely with the onset of rain and long debris run-outs are possible. The period of poorest stability will be overnight, thereafter further weakly bonded new windslab will again form in highest, sheltered lee locations on mainly North to East aspects above 900m. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Fluctuating temperature with showers throughout. There will be some rain at all levels for a period overnight, thereafter the Freezing level will lower again to around 800 metres. Strong generally West North Westerly winds becoming West later.

Comments

Changeable conditions with poor stability overnight and onset of rain at all levels, improving with cooler conditions during the day
