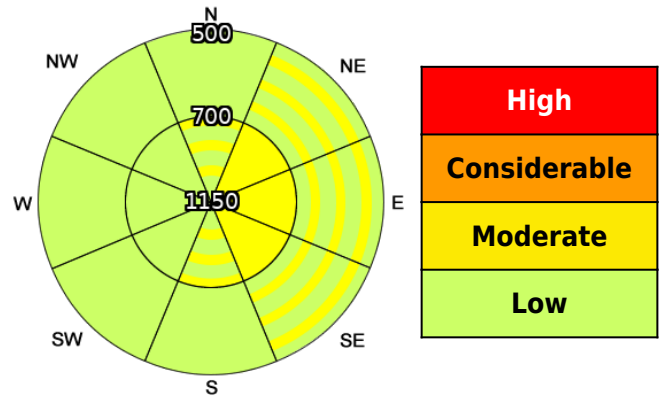

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Overnight the existing snowpack will become wet. Through the day it will freeze and consolidate in the colder conditions. However, fresh areas of unstable windslab will develop on North-East to South-East aspects above 700 metres. These areas are not expected to be extensive, with the tops of slopes and gullies being most affected. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

Overnight snow will briefly turn to rain and sleet as the freezing level rises to summit level. The freezing level will drop early in the morning to around 600 metres where it will remain through the day. Precipitation falling as snow above 400 metres. Moderate to strong winds will be from the West.
