Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Further weakly bonded windslab will develop on steep mainly North-Easterly and East facing aspects above 800 metres, some localised cross-loading onto high, wind sheltered, steep sided, North and South-East facing gully flanks above 900m will also occur. Newly formed cornices will be suspect. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable

Forecast Weather Influences

A showery Westerly airflow will bring snow showers throughout above 600m. Freezing levels lowering slightly during the day. Strong generally West South West winds will become more Westerly from first light.
