

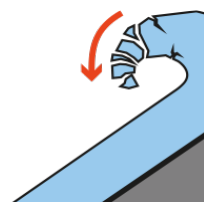

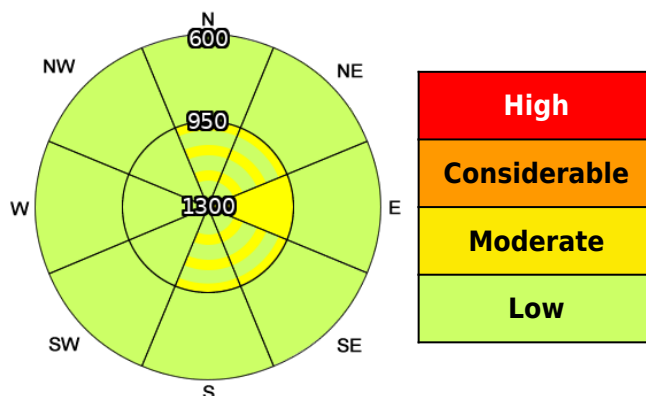

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will continue to thaw and diminish in extent. Consolidation and stabilisation will continue but surface instabilities such as avalanche sloughs will be likely on the steepest slopes, most affected will be where deepest accumulations lie on mainly Easterly to Southerly aspects above 950 metres. Rockfall below crags and cornice collapse onto slopes will also be a significant hazard. Generally snowpack stability will be good elsewhere. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Very strong South-Westerly winds overnight will become light to moderate strength by morning. Some light drizzle at all levels in the early hours dying out by mid morning, then a dry day. Freezing levels above the summits.

Comments

Mild for the next few days, Colder on Saturday with freezing level around 700 metres.
