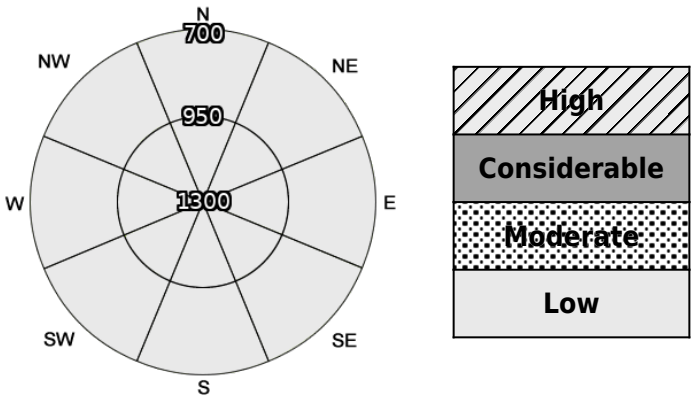
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack will re-freeze to become firm well bonded and stable at all altitudes and on all aspects. Greatest amounts are on North through East to Southerly aspects above 950 metres. Shallow accumulations of windslab will develop on Northerly to Easterly aspects above 900 metres; however these will be isolated and generally avoidable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light snow showers will clear away during the morning to leave a mostly dry day. Strong to gale force West-South-Westerly winds will veer to the West and ease through the afternoon. The 500 metre freezing level will rise to 800 metres during the day.

Comments

The old snowpack will refreeze. Serious run out potential will develop on steep slopes.
