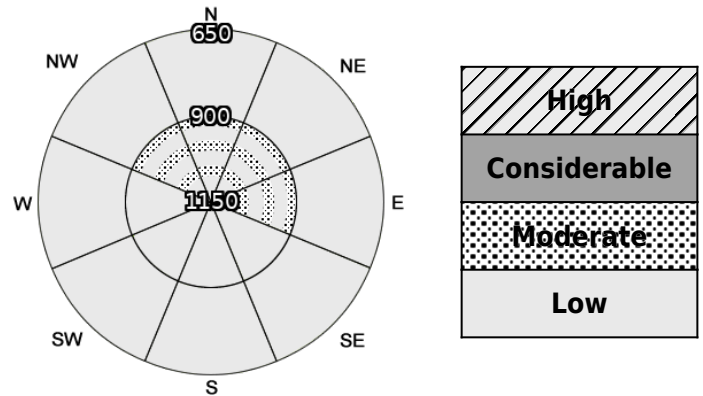

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The older moist snowpack will start to re-freeze and consolidate becoming icy in places. New snow amounts are not expected to be that substantial. However, fresh windslab will develop mainly on North to East aspects above 900 metres, these accumulations are not expected to be deep or extensive. But sheltered gullies, their exit flanks and scarp slopes will be more affected. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, the freezing level will fall to around 500 metres with light snow showers falling mainly above 400 metres accompanied by strong West-South-Westerly winds. During the day further light snow showers, slightly drier in the afternoon with winds easing becoming Westerly.
