

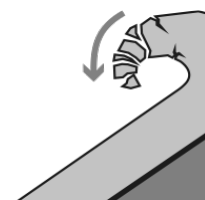

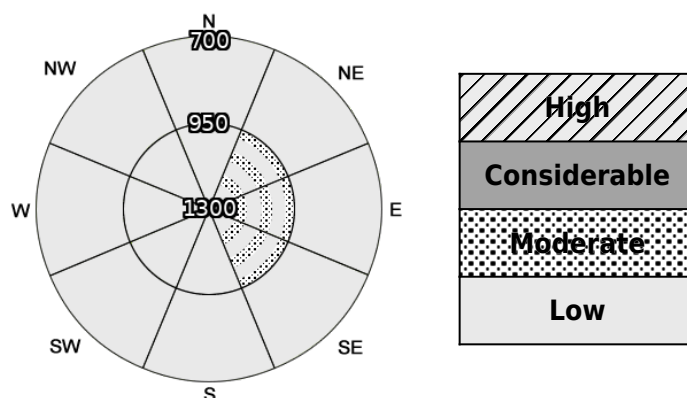
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New accumulations of unstable windslab will develop on North-East to South-East aspects above 950 metres. Areas most affected will be around coire rims, gully exits and convexities. Fragile cornices will begin to develop on these aspects. Elsewhere the old snowpack will remain firm well bonded and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers above 600 to 700 metres on strong to gale force Westerly winds. These will be heaviest during the morning. The freezing level will fluctuate between 700 and 800 metres.

Comments

Old snowpack re-frozen and firm. Serious run out potential on steep slopes into boulder fields below.
