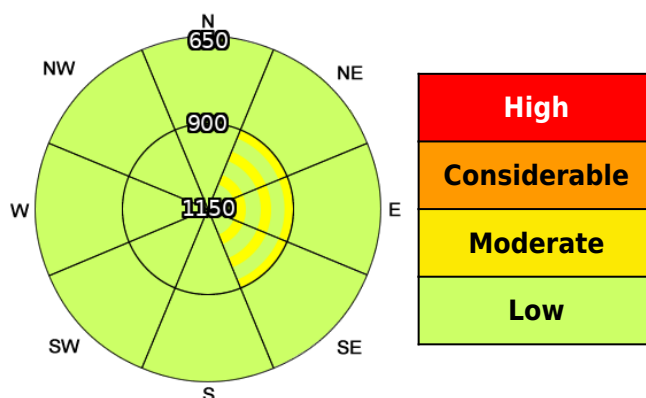


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Sunday 24/03/2019****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The snowpack will remain well consolidated on all aspects and icy in some places. New accumulations of fresh windslab will develop on North-East to South-East aspects above 900 metres. These are not expected to be deep or extensive with tops of sheltered gullies and corrie rims being most affected. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Strong to gale force blustery West South-Westerly winds gradually veering West-North-Westerly during the day and easing slightly. Showers overnight and early tomorrow but dying out during the afternoon. These will initially fall as snow above 600 metres and then 800 metres as the freezing level rises briefly around dawn. Turning to snow above 600 metres later in the day as the freezing level drops.

Comments

Feeling wintry on the tops with a dusting of fresh snow but windier tomorrow.
