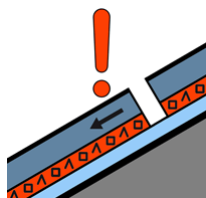
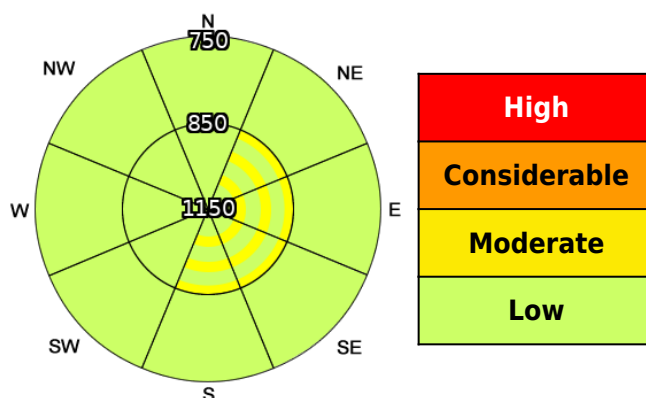


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Saturday 30/03/2019****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Persistent Weak Layers****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The older snowpack will start to firm up as colder conditions return overnight. New snow and North-Westerly winds will form unstable accumulations of windslab in sheltered gullies and on East to Southerly aspects mainly above 850 metres. These accumulations are not expected to be deep or extensive. In other areas stability will remain good. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

A return to colder conditions overnight will give a period of persistent snow above 600 metres early Saturday morning. Winds will be mainly North-Westerly fresh with stronger gusts in exposed locations. Freezing levels lowering to around 700 metres.

Comments

Colder outlook than of late, Fresh cornices will be fragile, areas of windslab should generally be avoidable with forward planning.
