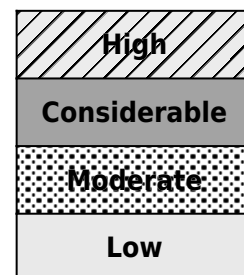
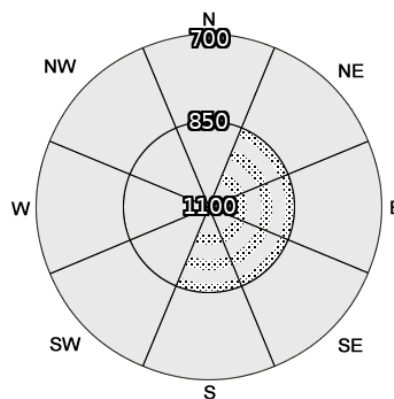
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The surface of the existing moist snowpack will re-freeze in the colder conditions and will be stable. Fresh unstable windslab will be deposited in sheltered areas, mainly on North-East through East to South aspects above 850 metres. Accumulations are expected to be generally localised. Gullies, coire rims and ridge flanks will be most affected. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Strong South-Westerly winds this evening will veer West-North-Westerly overnight and be moderate to strong North-Westerly during the day. The freezing level will be above the summits this evening, then lower to around 700 metres before dawn. Precipitation will fall as rain at all levels this evening, then turn to snow above 600 metres. The day is expected to be mainly dry.
