

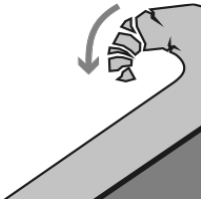

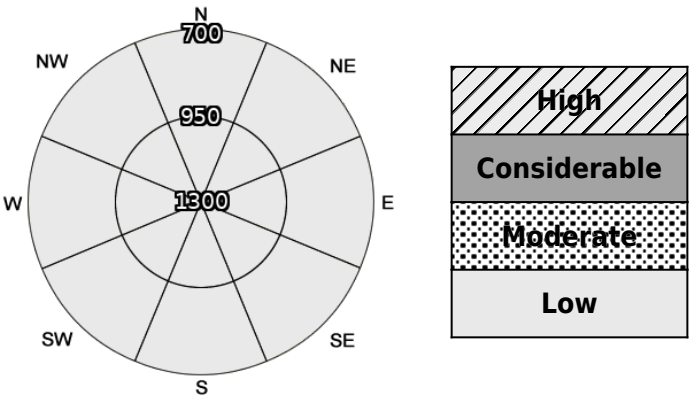

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack will remain firm well bonded and stable. Greatest amounts are on North-East to South-East aspects above 900 metres. Shallow accumulations of windslab will develop on North-West to North-East aspects above 950 metres. These will be generally avoidable and limited in extent. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Moderate Southerly winds will increase strong to gale force during the day. Dry conditions up until midday, light snowfall above 700 metres throughout the afternoon. The freezing level will fluctuate between 800 and 900 metres.
