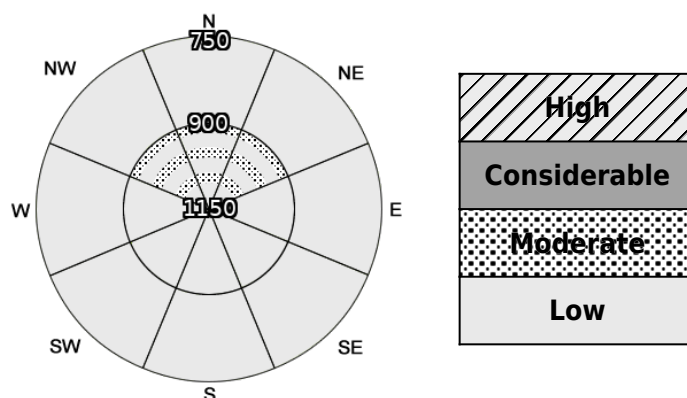


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 01/04/2019****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The existing snowpack will remain firm. Fresh areas of windslab will develop through the day in sheltered locations on mainly North-West to North-East aspects above 900 metres. These are not expected to be particularly extensive, and should generally be avoidable. The tops of slopes and gullies will be most affected. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

After a generally dry night showers are expected during the day. These will fall as snow above 700 metres. The freezing level will be around 800 metres. Southerly winds will strengthen.
