
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The existing and limited snowpack will remain firm and well consolidated throughout. Fresh snow expected, particularly overnight, where small localised areas of windslab will develop in steep sheltered North to East aspects, mainly above 700 metres, but will generally be shallow and avoidable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Heavy overnight showers, wintry above 400 metres, will become lighter and isolated through the day. The freezing level will rise from 400 metres overnight to around 600 metres in the afternoon and the Southerly wind will ease and veer overnight becoming a light North-Westerly midday, strengthening Northerly later .

Comments

Winds becoming Northerly to Easterly over next few days, with less precipitation in the North West than more eastern ranges.
