

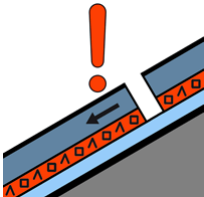

Wind Slab



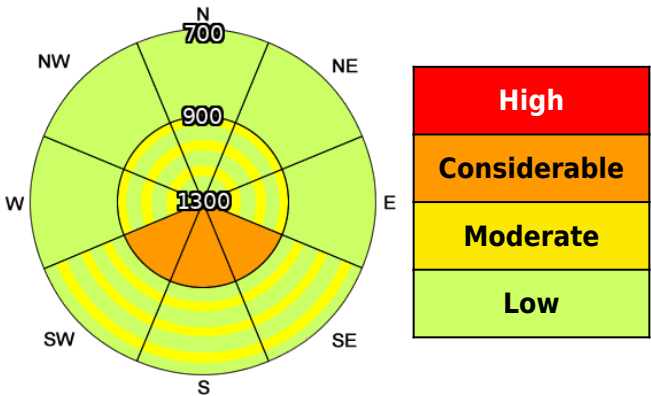
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Poorly bonded windslab will develop on mainly South-East to South-West facing slopes above 900 metres. Greatest instability will be where accumulations develop over the existing old snow especially in steep, sheltered and convex areas. Fragile cornices will develop on these aspects. Instabilities will also be present on many other aspects due to cross loading. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Snowfall throughout the forecast period, this will be heavy at times especially through the morning. Strong to gale force Northerly winds will veer to the East-North-East through the afternoon. The freezing level will rise from 500 to 800 metres by the afternoon.

Significant snowfall expected; however exact amount uncertain.
