

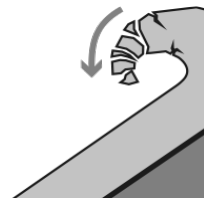

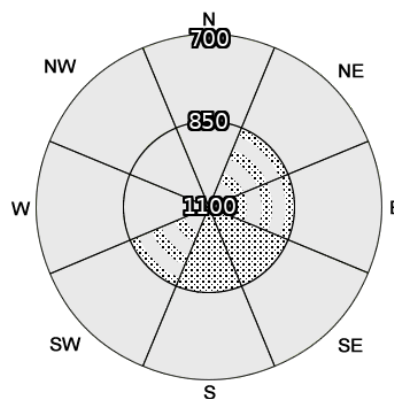
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Moderately bonded new windslab will develop in high sheltered lee locations. Most affected areas will be gully exits and the top of coire backwalls above 850 metres, on East through South to South-Westerly aspects. Stability will be poorest and deteriorate as newly drifted accumulations deepen as the day progresses. Any new cornice development will be fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Further snow showers are expected over the period, although, due to timings and intensity as it crosses from the East the quantities remain uncertain. The Freezing level will fluctuate around 500 metres, rising to around 800 metres, with snow showers at times down to 300 metres. The winds will be strong to very strong North and North- Easterly.

Comments

Strong winds and the quantity of snow may be less or greater than expected.
