

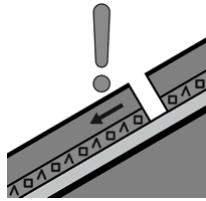

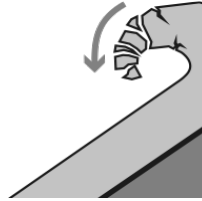

Wind Slab



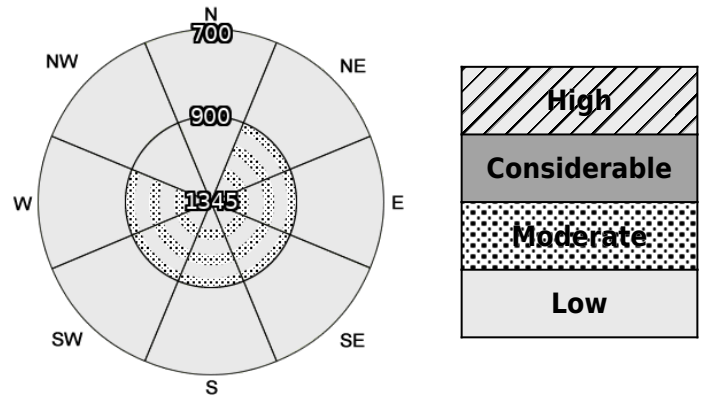
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Snowfall and redistribution of existing snow will deposit fresh unstable windslab in sheltered areas. Greatest accumulations will be on East through South to West aspects above 900 metres. Gullies, coire rims and ridge flanks will be most affected. Any new cornices will be fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will be very strong North-North-Easterly. After some evening snow showers above 500 metres, the night is expected to be dry. Then a band of precipitation is expected to cross during the day, falling as light snow above around 500 metres. During the day the freezing level will rise from 400 metres to around 750 metres.

Comments

There is uncertainty about the intensity of the snowfall. Amend the avalanche hazard accordingly.
