


Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Snowfall and redistribution of existing snow will deposit fresh unstable windslab into wind sheltered areas. Greatest accumulations will be on South-East through South to North-West aspects above 800 metres. Gullies, coire rims and ridge flanks will be most affected. Any new cornices will be fragile. On slopes exposed to the strong winds the snowpack will be frozen hard and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Strong East-North-Easterly winds. Mainly dry overnight followed by snow showers. Freezing level around 600 metres overnight rising to 1000 metres in the afternoon.
