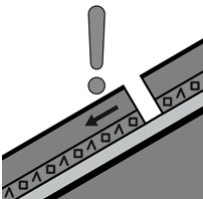


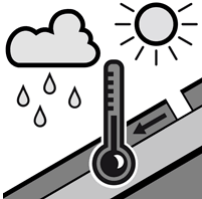

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 05/04/2019

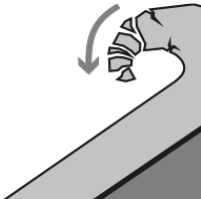

Persistent Weak Layers



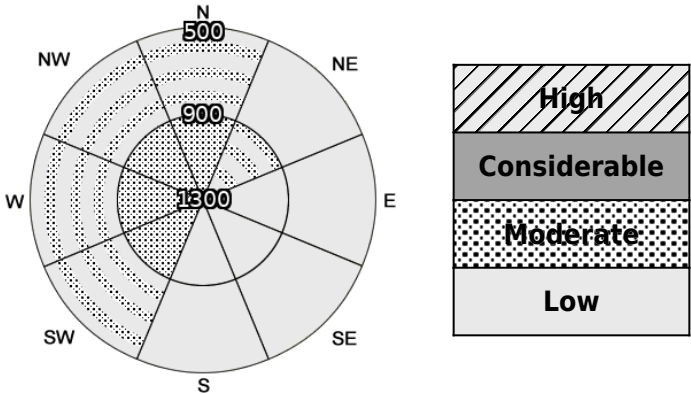

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack, although soft and deep in many areas, stability will generally improve. Above 900m instabilities will persist in the deep windslab especially on South-West through West to Northerly aspects above 900m, gully exits, steep slope tops and convex shaped terrain most affected. Cornices here will be unstable. All South to West facing slopes will be affected with surface instabilities and sloughs, especially at lower elevations and above 500 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

A dry forecast period is expected. Winds will be moderate strength South-Easterly throughout becoming light by the end of the afternoon. Freezing levels around 700 metres rising to above the summits during the day.

Comments

Overnight cooler temperatures then milder conditions should help with snowpack consolidation.
