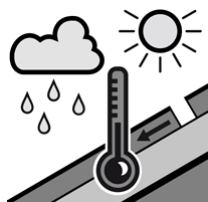


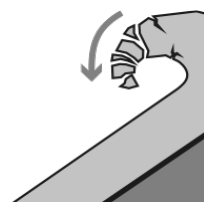

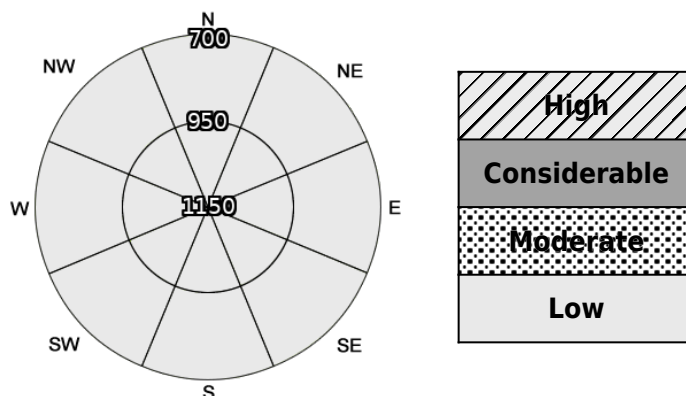

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Snowpack stability will generally remain good on all aspects and elevations. However, on steep North-West through North to East aspects above 950 metres these slopes may be affected with surface instabilities and wet snow sloughs. Cornices above these aspects will also be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

Rain showers will die out this evening followed by a dry night and the freezing level above the summits. A dry, mild, cloudy day with fresh to strong Easterly winds.

**Comments**

Outlook; Mostly dry Sunday night and Monday, freezing at first near summits before temperatures rise again. Tuesday will be dry, with freezing levels dropping to 900 metres. Fresh to strong Easterly winds at summit level.
