

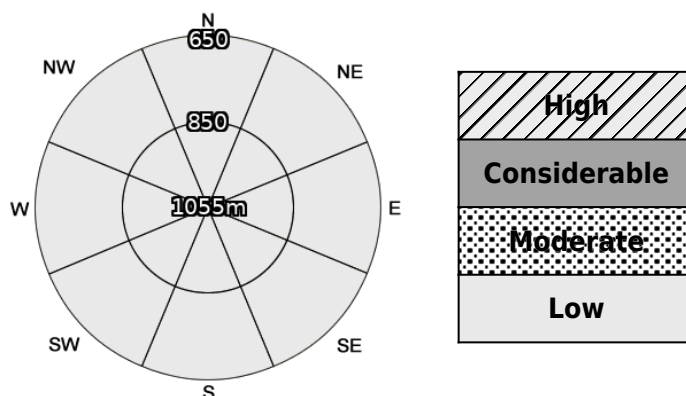

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 08/04/2019

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The moist and diminishing snowpack will continue to consolidate, with a slow thaw at all levels and have good stability throughout. Most snow will exist on Westerly aspects, mainly above 850 metres, while areas of firmer old snow remain on Easterly aspects. Little snow below 650 metres. Many summits and ridges are bare. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Cloud will gradually break to give a dry and bright day with spells of sunshine particularly in the afternoon and the Easterly airflow will ease overnight becoming a light to moderate breeze later in the day. The freezing level will remain well above the summits.

Comments

Brightening up and dry for the next few days and the Easterly wind easing.
