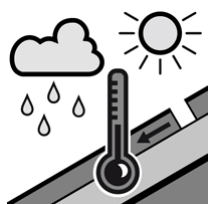
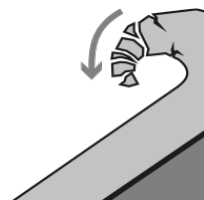
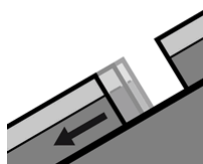
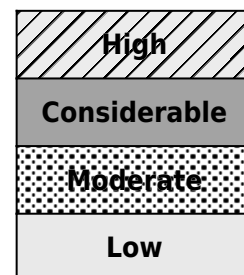
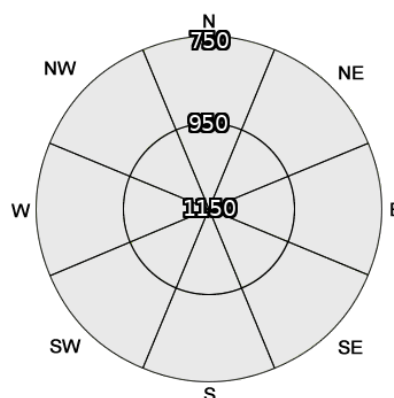


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 08/04/2019****Avalanche Problems****Wet Snow****Cornices****Gliding Snow****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The snowpack will continue to slowly thaw but stability will remain generally good on all aspects and elevations. However, on steep North-West through North to East aspects above 950 metres these could be affected with localised surface instabilities and wet snow sloughs. Cornices above these aspects will also be unstable and prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Overnight, slightly cooler conditions but during the day the freezing level will be well above the summits. Remaining generally dry with fresh Easterly winds.

Comments

Mainly dry with colder air gradually spreading from the East with freezing level lowering to 400-600m by Wednesday.
