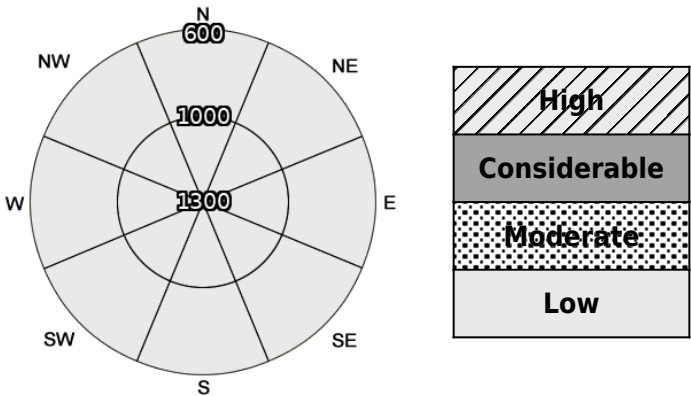

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will continue to consolidate and stability will be generally good throughout. Deepest accumulations are on Southerly through West to Northerly facing slopes above 900 metres. Surface instabilities on steep and convex terrain will continue to be a hazard especially on sun exposed slopes. Slumping cornices which overhang these areas will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Dry throughout with sunny spells during the day and light to moderate South-Easterly winds. Becoming cooler for a spell around midday as the freezing level falls to around summit levels.
