

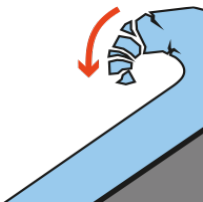

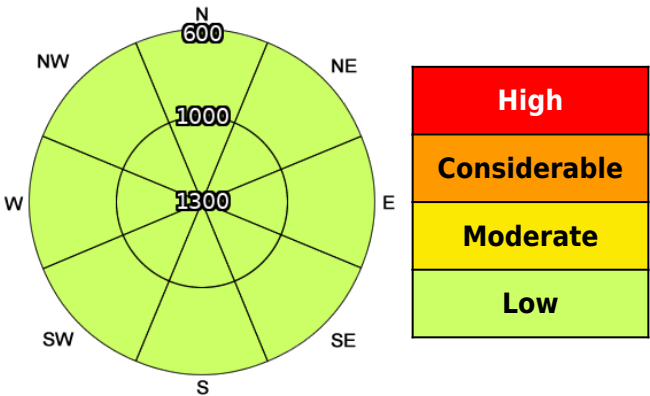
Wet Snow

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will continue to consolidate and remain generally well bonded and stable on all aspects and altitudes. Any remaining cornices on sun exposed slopes will be prone to collapse, also surface instabilities in these areas developing through the day. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

A dry and clear night with sunshine through the day. Light South-East winds will gradually veer to the North during the afternoon. The freezing level will fall to around 600 metres and steadily rise to 1000 metres by the end of the day.
