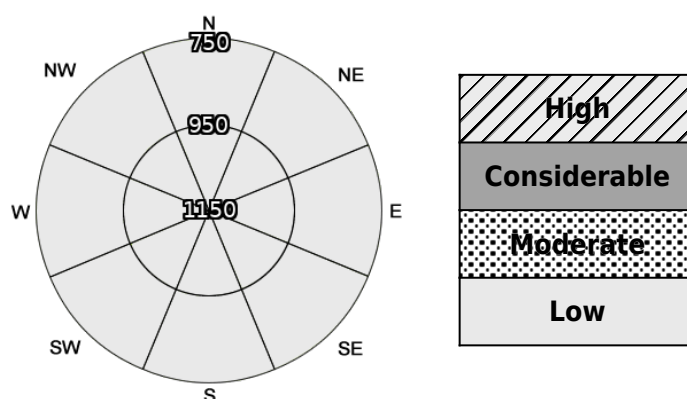


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Sunday 14/04/2019****Avalanche Problems****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

After a cool start the snowpack will slowly soften particularly where exposed to solar radiation. The stability will remain generally good on all aspects and elevations. The snow surface in shaded areas and those exposed to the strong winds may well remain firm and icy. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

After an overnight frost in the glens the freezing level will rise to around 900 metres during the day. It will remain dry with strong South-Easterly winds with severe chill effects.

Last report for the season.....

Dry, settled conditions continuing albeit windy over the summits. Snow surface in shaded areas and those exposed to the strong SE winds will remain firm and icy with some potentially serious run outs.
