

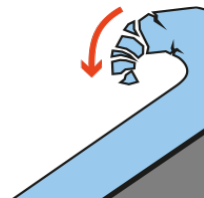

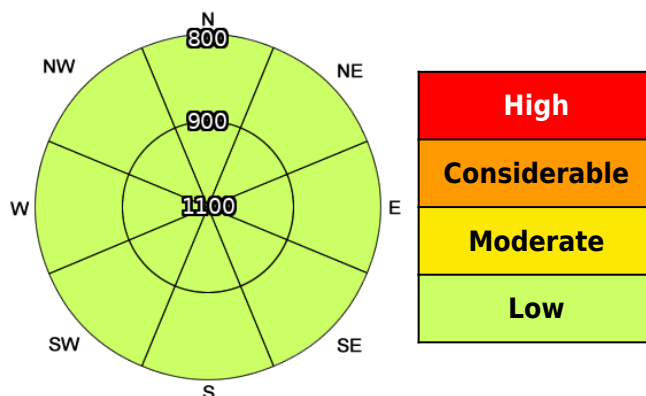

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

All refrozen old snow patches will refreeze and be stable. Localised accumulations of new moderately bonded windslab will begin to develop on steep and sheltered NE to SE facing aspects above 900m. Gully tops and coire rims will be the most affected areas. Good stability in all other locations. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Rain turning to snow for a time overnight then dry. More frequent snow showers expected from dawn onwards. Sharp drop in freezing level from well above summits to 600m in the early hours. Moderate W winds becoming strong later.

Comments

Wintry on Friday with snow showers from dawn onwards. New drifted snow accumulating on largely bare ground. Exact track of expected shower activity difficult to predict with more or less snowfall possible in our area.
